Education and discipleship were the foundation of Ndoto more than ten years ago when we launched, and it's still the backbone of what we do.

Because of Ndoto, 525 students have been able to go to school who wouldn't otherwise have had that chance. Zadock, who got only A's in high school, couldn't afford his school fees and was sponsored by Ndoto to earn a Chemical Engineering degree. He graduated last year and is now working at Kisumu's water company.

Others like Silas take the route of specialized training. Silas had given up hope and fallen in with bad company when he found Ndoto. He studied motor vehicle mechanics for several years at the local YMCA and graduated last year. Today, Silas says he would be unrecognizable to his former friends.


Ndoto has never been content to stop with just educating people. We are committed to total life change. In addition to intellectual growth, we invest in spiritual, emotional, social, and physical needs. Phanice, at right, underwent risky brain surgery to save her life and went on to graduate high school last year. Janet, one of our original students, got pregnant at 16 and was unsure of her future, but Ndoto gave her, as she described, "stability, peace, comfort, and strength." Now she works as a nurse fighting COVID-19.

Ndoto Community Church is a cornerstone of our mission. Young and old alike come to know God and become more like Jesus through the church's ministries. Mr. Livingstone, who had a drinking problem, accepted an invitation to church for the first time. In time, it transformed his life. He placed his faith in Jesus, was freed from things that

bound him, and is now sharing with his friends what God has done.

Back in 2006, a graduate student came to Kenya and did a lengthy community assessment in Obunga. Her conclusion from their feedback was that the number one need was for jobs and capital to start businesses. "Jesus and Jobs," as we often say, are at the heart of our mission. Our desire is that God transforms people and we help empower them to live fulfilling and abundant lives.

After a decade of providing loans to small business entrepreneurs, Ndoto is now ready to work on creating jobs at a larger scale. With the lessons learned from Ndoto's chicken business, we have new plans for larger businesses that can meet people's needs, create jobs, and even make money to expand Ndoto's ministry.

Evans (top left) is training to be a chef. Exodus (bottom

left) knows Kenyan Sign Language. Edward is an accomplished Structural Engineer working on a stadium. Judy, our first graduate in education, now teaches in Dubai. In just the last two years, Ndoto has graduated 11 nurses, doctors, and nutritionists.

Next, Ndoto plans to purchase land to begin to develop these businesses. We have been saving for several years for this ambitious purchase and we invite you to join us on this journey. For the next few years, we plan to maintain approximately 300 students in our program as we focus on growing our church ministry and creating businesses.
